Hummingbird Nectar Recipe

- \$ Boil 4 parts water with 1 part plain white granulated table sugar for 2 minutes
- Allow the mixture to cool, then fill your feeder(s) with just enough nectar to last a few days.
- Store leftover nectar in a clean container in the fridge for up to 10 days.
- *This water-to-white sugar ratio is the closest to the sucrose levels they find in nature.

IMPORTANT:

- Never use honey, sweeteners, molasses, brown or raw sugar
- Don't add red food colouring or other products
- On the winter, don't alter the recipe or allow feeders to freeze**
- **When nectar freezes, the ice displaces the sugar, so the remaining syrup has a very high sugar concentration. In the wild, hummers can tolerate slightly higher amounts of sugar, as long as they have a dietary source of water. However, in freezing conditions, water sources may not be available.

Tips to Keep Feeders Thawed in Winter

- 1 Keep feeder in a protected area, covered and out of the wind
- lack Have a feeder indoors to swap out when the other begins to freeze
- Owrap non-LED holiday lights around the glass column of inverted feeders
- O Place Saucer feeders on a waterproof heat mat (sold for sprouting seedlings)
- Olnvest in (or build) a hummingbird feeder heater

REMEMBER:

- ♦ Clean feeders to prevent bacterial or fungal growth - at least once a week, and every 2-3 days in the summer.
- ♦ Every time a hummer sticks its tongue in, the nectar gets inoculated with microbes, which eat the sugar.
